Services Available at a Community Access Point (CAP Site)



Who can use a CAP site?

Community Access Points serve northern residents who want to access learning opportunities and information.

Individuals who are pursuing a career, working on a post-secondary degree, or upgrading their employment and professional skills are welcome at any CAP site. CAP services such as career and educational information or counselling, study space, or Internet services may be used even if you have not registered in a course.

What services are available?

Programs and Courses

Northern Alberta post-secondary institutions are the primary providers of instructional services to the CAP sites. From our course and program lists, you can choose the courses, programs, and credentials that best suit their needs, including:

- ✓ University degree and certificate courses and programs
- ✓ College certificate and diploma courses and programs
- ✓ Specialized trades and technology courses and programs
- ✓ Academic upgrading courses and programs
- ✓ Non-credit courses

You are able to access course and program offerings from other institutions as well at the CAP site.

Learning Support Services

You have access to a diversity of services provided by the local CAP sites and institutions. Learning and support services include:

- ✓ Exam supervision
- ✓ Tutoring (e.g. writing and numerical skills, content tutoring, exam preparation, test writing skills, communication skills, managing time)
- ✓ Counseling referrals (e.g. financial, career and employment counseling)
- ✓ Opportunities for interaction with instructors and other students
- ✓ Timely feedback on progress and performance

Information and Learning Resource Services

With the assistance of the CAP Coordinator, you have access to:

- ✓ Electronic and print-based learning resources
- ✓ Inter-library loans
- ✓ Information retrieval skills training
- ✓ Educational media

Learning Technology Services

Learning technologies are used to send and receive information such as course materials, instruction, assignments, messages, and electronic mail. Alberta-North uses technologies to support a wide range of learning opportunities. The following are brief descriptions of these technologies:

Audioconference

Used for group instruction or individual tutoring sessions. Students and instructor are at different locations and communicate orally using the phone system, speaker phone or convener and microphones.

Audiographics

Students and instructors communicate orally and through text messages in real time, view slides on the computer screen, interact by using drawing tools (a mouse or tablet and pen), and surf the Internet together. Group sessions are scheduled and usually mandatory.

Videoconference

Students see and hear their instructor and other students through two-way video. Sessions are scheduled and usually mandatory.

Learning Management Systems (LMS)

Students are provided with continuous access to course information via the Internet as well as around-the-clock communication with the instructor and other students.

Internet Services

The Internet provides a gateway to vast amounts of information from all around the world.

Specialized Support

Labs – Field work, work placement, clinical placement or practicums that are part of the program will be arranged by the program department.

Services Available at a Community Access Point (CAP Site)

Assistance from the CAP Coordinator

The Community Access Point Coordinator is available to help people find information, apply for a course, use the equipment, find resources and support students throughout their programs.

Program and Career Information

CAP Coordinators have information about the programs and courses that are available. They have copies of current program calendars and web site addresses for all of Alberta's post-secondary institutions. They have assessment tools and information on career choices to help people select a suitable career.

Forms

CAP Coordinators can help find the necessary forms and assist in completing them. The forms frequently required are:

- ✓ Application for Admission
- ✓ Transcript Request
- ✓ Withdrawal/Change of Registration

Fees and Funding

CAP Coordinators can help identify the fees required and in some cases will collect those fees and forward the money to the institution. Some of the fees are:

- ✓ Application/registration fees
- ✓ Tuition fees
- ✓ Transcript fees
- ✓ Other fees such as library, late registration, course challenge, graduation, etc.

CAP Coordinators may also help with applications for scholarships, bursaries and grants, or make a referral to a counselor.

Resource Centre

CAP sites will have a collection of books, pamphlets, and materials that students may use to complete their course work. These resources are used on-site. Typical resource materials include: career resources, student orientation materials, computer guides, encyclopedias, dictionaries, thesauruses, etc.

Preparation for Courses

CAP Coordinators schedule the equipment students need for receiving a course. They will show students how to use the equipment and the fax machine. As well they will help get the materials and texts needed for the course.

Support for Learners

Throughout a course, CAP Coordinators are available to supervise exams, provide referrals for tutoring and counseling, provide information on time management, study skills and other topics, and provide encouragement and support. Their goal is to make each student's learning experience a positive experience.

- ✓ Access to a computer with CD-ROM, printer, and Internet access

Basic Hardware Requirements

- ✓ Pentium class platform with Windows NT or Windows 95 or XP; Power PC MacOS system 7 or any later version

Basic Software Requirements

- ✓ Microsoft Word for Windows and Anti Virus Software
- ✓ Basic knowledge of word processing, file management, email, and Internet navigation

■ Audiographics Courses – Northern Lakes College

Minimum system requirements for Centra courses:

- ✓ Computer with CD-ROM drive, Windows 2000 or later
- ✓ Internet Explorer 6.0 or later or Netscape 5.0 or later
- ✓ 112 kbps or faster Internet connection per computer station
- ✓ Pentium 1.8 GHz, 512+ MB memory, at least 1 GB hard drive space sound card, speakers and a microphone or headset
- ✓ A graphics tablet is required for most math and science courses. (Tablet recommended is a Wacom Bamboo or graphire 3x5 or 6x9)

Alberta-North - Admission & Registration Information

Admissions

The information in this section applies to students taking courses at the CAP sites. (Students taking courses directly from any of the member institutions will follow the normal institutional admission and registration processes which can be found on each institution's web site.)

Follow these steps to be admitted to an Alberta-North institution:

1. Before registering for a course, first time applicants must complete an "Application for Admission" form from an Alberta-North member institution of the student's choice. This form is then sent to the institution with the "Application Fee" where required.
2. If the student has already taken a course from a member institution, and it has been more than one year, a "Re-Admission" form may be needed. Check with the institution.
3. Application forms may also be submitted by fax or mail, and some institutions offer online admission/registration at their web site or through a telephone registration system.
4. The student should receive a letter from the institution(s) indicating whether prerequisites are satisfied and/or if they will be admitted into the course or program. (Requesting that the Registrar's office respond by fax to the CAP site can speed up this process.)
5. The Registrar's office will make ALL decisions relating to the admission of students who apply to that institution.
6. Because the admission/registration process is quite time sensitive, if you have not heard back in a timely fashion, students may ask the CAP Coordinator to contact the institution's Registrar on behalf of the student.

The CAP Coordinator will assist the students in arranging the following:

- ✓ Interviews for admission, finance, or funding processes
- ✓ Meetings for educational planning or career advisement
- ✓ Appointments for entrance, placement, or aptitude testing

Transcripts (Unofficial and Official)

Students may request that an unofficial transcript be sent from one Alberta-North institution to another at no cost to the student. Fees are charged for all official transcripts requested by a student, regardless of where they are sent. Refer to the "Summary of Ancillary Fees" in the institution's calendar for specific information on transcript fees. A student must complete the transcript request form of the institution where the student's grades are being held. This form is then to be submitted to the CAP Coordinator to forward.

NOTE: If a student has grades at more than one institution, then a transcript request form must be filled out for each institution.

Credit Transferability

Alberta-North is NOT an educational institution.

The granting of course credits and accreditation in various programs is done by the partner member institutions within Alberta-North. This is a coordinated effort among the institutions.

The following regulation has been agreed to by the member institutions:

“For purposes of fulfilling residency requirements, courses taken at Athabasca University, Aurora College (NT), Grande Prairie Regional College, Keyano College, NorQuest College, Northern Lakes College, and Portage College, will be considered to be courses taken at all partnering institutions and may be used to fulfill residency requirements to the extent that they have been approved for transfer credit and fit into the individual program.”

“Residency” is the requirement by a delivering institution that a certain number of courses or credits must be completed at that institution before it will grant a parchment.

“Parchment” is a certificate, diploma, or degree granted by a college or university for completion of an approved program, as specified by Alberta Advanced Education and Technology (the provincial government department responsible for monitoring all post-secondary education within Alberta).

Determining Transferability of Credits

To determine credit transferability is often complex and may be confusing. Since students may need to earn credits to complete a certificate, diploma, or degree, it is critical that accurate credit transfer information is provided. The Alberta Council on Admissions and Transfer (ACAT) prepares a guide which can be used to explore transferability with a student. The guide is available at www.acat.gov.ab.ca.

NOTE: To be sure of accurate information, students are advised to contact the institution that will be awarding the parchment. Students are recommended to ask the institution to provide, in writing, their decision about whether the credits can be transferred.
